# Rules and Notices on Disposing Recyclable Items and Garbage

### 1 Sorting

Recyclable items or waste not sorted cannot be accepted. The person responsible for the rejected waste is required to take it back and be sure to sort the waste before putting it out on the next collection day.



#### 2 Types of collection bag

Be sure to put combustible waste and noncombustible waste in a pay bag (designated collection bag), respectively.(From April 1, 2015)

Any waste which is not put in the pay bags (designated collection bags) cannot be accepted in all fairness.

Other items, except paper, food and beverage cans and bottles, which are put in transparent or semitransparent bags (up to 45L) or plastic bags from stores can be accepted.





#### 3 Take out time of waste

Be sure to take waste out to a clean station by 8:30 in the morning on collection days.

Any waste taken out after the collection is done will not be collected.



#### 4 Waste amount (per household)

Up to 5 bags (transparent Up to 5 bags or 5 bundles! or semi-transparent bags up to 45L) or 5 bundles of recyclable items or waste are acceptable at a time for one household's output (or 5 pay bags (designated collection bag) of 40L).



Large amounts of garbage generated from moving or big cleanups cannot be taken out to a clean station. (See page 19 for garbage from moving or big cleanups.)

Large amounts of garbage taken out at a time may block up a passage or exceed the collection capacity. Your cooperation in scheduling disposal of reasonable amount is appreciated.

#### 5 take out to predefined clean station.

Clean stations are to be managed and maintained by the people who use it. Do not take your garbage out to any clean station other than the predefined station for your district. (If you don't know the right place, conform it with your neighbors, real estate

agent or landlord.) Put a protective net over the whole waste placed at a station to prevent it from being scavenged by crows.



#### 6 Waste from businesses are not accepted

Wastes generated from business activities are not to be brought to clean stations.



Wastes taken out against the rule will be left at the clean station and it will spoil a town sight and annoy people in the neighborhood. The person responsible for such waste is required to take it back.

# 2 Waste collected by voluntary cleaning

Waste generated from voluntary cleaning activities on public roads and other places will be collected without charge. Take such waste out in transparent or semi-transparent bags (up to 45L) by marking "SEISOU GOMI" (waste from cleaning activities) on them.

\*Waste such as fallen leaves should be taken out on the yard trimmings collection days.

# 3 Disposable diapers (except those used for pet animals)

Dirt must be removed. Do not put anything other than paper diapers in a bag. (see page 3)



#### Exemption system in regard to pay bags (designated collection bags)

#### Households to which the exemption is applicable

A certain number of designated collection bags will be provided to the households that fall in any of the followings.

- \*Even if the same household falls in more than one of the followings, the number of bags to be provided will not be increased.
- ◇Public assistance recipient household
- ♦ Child rearing allowance recipient household
- ♦ Special child rearing allowance recipient household
- Qualified household for medical subsidy to single-parent families, etc.

Delivery of bags will start from late February 2015.

- For detailed information on how to receive bags, please refer to a notice sent to corresponding households, public bulletins, etc.
- \*At the time of delivery of pay bags (designated collection bags), please prepare a bigger bag so that you can carry them back in it.

#### Instructions for items with a size approximately over 50cm in length, width or height that can be taken out as combustible waste

- Bath tub cover (accordion type), reed screens, barshaped items excluding metal part (walking sticks, bats, brooms, mops, rackets, etc.)
- Wrap bar-shaped waste with a pay bag (designated collection bag) or tie it with other bag large enough for this purpose.
- When there are several items to dispose of, they can be wrapped or tied together. (However, combustible waste and non-combustible waste must be bundled and taken out separately.)

#### Wrap the waste with a bag and affix with tape.

## Note! Waste cannot be accepted if:

- Cushions, pillows, sponge mats or similar items
- Put it in a pay bag(designated collection bag) as a basic procedure.
- Fold flexible items before putting in a bag. Tie off the top of the bag

\*Items that cannot be put in a 40L bag are classified as Large Items.

Affix a pay bag (designated collection bag) of 40L on it. \*When there are several items to dispose of, tie them together with a string.



#### Instruction for items with a size approximately over 50 cm in length, width or height that can be accepted as non-combustible waste

- Bar-shaped metal items Umbrellas, inflators, ski poles, bats, walking sticks, mops, brooms, rackets, etc.
- Wrap bar-shaped waste with a pay bag (designated collection bag) or tie it with other bag large enough for this purpose.
- When there are several items to dispose of, they can be wrapped or tied together.

(However, combustible waste and non-combustible waste must be bundled and taken out separately.)

Tie the waste using a bag.



Wrap the wastes with a bag and affix with tape.



#### Ceramics (tableware), frying pans

Put it in a pay bag (designated collection bag) as a basic procedure.

\*Items that cannot be put in a 40L bag are classified as Large Items.

#### Tricycles (made of metal)

Place it in a pay bag (designated collection bag) as far as possible and firmly affix the bag on the waste with tape, etc.



\*The bag shown is just an example.

#### •Golf clubs (up to 3 pieces)

Wrap or tie the waste with a pay bag (designated collection bag). (More than 3 pieces are classified as Large Items.)

# Plastic containers and packaging


#### What are plastic containers and packaging materials?

They are the items to be sorted based on the Containers and Packaging Recycling Law which are plastic used for wrapping or packaging things and are no longer used after the good contained was used (or consumed) or taken out.



They have this mark on







Cups, packages



(except those having a PET bottle mark on them)







Others (plastic net bags for fruits or vegetables, lids and caps of bottles and tubes)

#### Following items are not classified as plastic containers and packaging materials



**Tubes** 

Items that have a PET bottle mark on them ⇒ Caps and labels are classified as plastic containers and packaging materials but the bottle itself is classified as PET bottle.




Plastic products made of composite material (except manufactured plastic goods), toys, stationeries, CDs, video tapes, etc. ⇒Combustible waste



Items that are not goods but used as a bag of containers or wrapping materials, laundry bags, envelopes of direct mail, etc. ⇒Combustible waste

#### Instructions

1) Empty a container.



Sticky label of price, etc. that is hard to peal off the container may be left on.

②Wipe out or rinse the inside.



Remaining food or soils should be wiped off or rinsed away with water.

③Place them in a transparent or semi-transparent bag (up to 45L).



**Double bags are**prohibited.
Do not put a bag of waste in another bag.



## How to wipe off the inside of containers?

For tubes of mayonnaise, ketchup, etc.

▶ Removing solid stuff remaining on the inside is enough.

① Cut off the top of a tube.



② The top with sticky soils should be taken out as combustible waste.



Put the tube upside down for easy use of remaining content that comes down.



For bottles of shampoo, cleaner and oil

There is no need to clean the inside. \*They should be emptied.





For containers with greasy dirt or strong smell (package or container of curry, small bags of noodle soup or other sauces, etc.)







Containers with greasy dirt or strong smell such as retortpackaging or container of curry and pickles containers should be taken out as combustible waste.



They need not to be washed using lots of water or cleaner. Water is also valuable

If containers stained or contaminated with a lot of dirt or foreign materials, the city may be charged with a disposal cost in full amount.

Plastic containers and packaging materials collected by the city will be sorted, compressed and packaged to be recycled as ammonia or others through the Japan Containers And Packaging Recycling Association (a public utility foundation). Most of the costs required for recycling are borne by recycling companies.

Quality inspection of plastic containers and packaging materials is conducted every year by the Japan Containers And Packaging Recycling Association. Collected waste may be rejected as a result of inspection if a lot of soils or foreign materials (cigarette lighters, etc.) are remained. In that case, the city will have to bear the cost of disposal of the rejected waste in full amount.



Compressed and packaged plastic containers and packaging materials are selected at random for quality inspection.









# Plastie goods

#### What are Plastic goods?

They are goods made of plastic except plastic containers and packaging materials which are manufactured using a single material of either polypropylene (PP) or polyethylene (PE).

### How to differentiate them?



#### Main 18 items





Items with a size approximately over 50 cm in length, width or height are classified as Large Items.

#### Instructions

1) Wash soils away.



Wash away sand and mud on plant pots and planters.




Stickers should be pealed off if possible.

- ②Leave a large sized item out as it is. Place small items in a transparent or semi-transparent bag (up to 45L).
- \*Deteriorated or broken items can be taken out as manufactured plastic goods unless they are soiled.
- \*If you don't know the material of a good, take it out as combustible waste.

## What products will be made after recycling?

They will turn into manufactured plastic goods once again.

(Including pallets for forklift and slopes to eliminate difference in level)

## Items that cannot be accepted as Plastic goods

Those that also have a plastic mark on them should be taken out as "Plastic containers and packaging materials."

\*If you don't know the material of a good, take it out as combustible waste.





#### Option 1

Put them in a paper bag and close the top of the bag using tape or staples.



(Paper bags which are not white on the inside can also be used.)

#### Option ②

Wrap them up in wrapping paper or calendar pages and secure them using tape or staples.



# Note!

 Do not put other materials such as metals together because it may cause a failure of machines.

(Small non-paper parts including cellophane in envelopes with windows, metal fixings such as staples, tape and stickers can be left on.)

Sheets of paper with ink or pigments (paint, crayon or sumi) can also be accepted.

Feel free to use the "Reuse Box" located in the city hall and branch offices from which you can take paper bags when you need it among those bags donated by people who no longer use them.



#### Different types of bag disposal between mixed paper and paperboard

The way of closing the top of the bag is different.

#### Mixed paper



Close the top of the bag using gummed tape or staples.

This type of bag will be recycled without opening for a reason of protection of personal information.

#### **Paperboard**



Tie the top of the bag containing paperboard with twine.

This type of bag will be opened and sorted out manually after collected.

Since we identify one from the other during collection according to how the bags are secured, your cooperation would be much appreciated.



## Paper recycling box spots

Paper including newspapers, magazines and used books, paperboard and cardboard (excluding mixed paper and paper cartons) can also be brought to the recycling box spots located at seven places within the city on days other than the fixed collection days.

#### 2Put them in bags

Place a certain amount of grass or raked leaves in transparent or semi-transparent bags (up to 45 L) and tie off the top of the bags. \*Wait until just before collection to bag the waste. This will prevent molding.



#### How much output is allowed to place at the clean station at a time?

A total of 5 bundles or bags is allowed for one household's output. Example: 3 bundles + 2 bags = 5



#### When you drop off yourself at the facility (with a charge)

Instructions

Keep pruned branches and stalks under < 1.5 m long and 60 cm thick and drop it off yourself.




② Prepare empty PET bottles. Rinse the inside and remove their labels.



Use 500 ml PET bottles, if possible.

3 Put the cooled oil into the PET bottles and put on the caps.



**4 Mark "SHOKUYO ABURA"** (Cooking oil) on the PET bottles using a marker. (Do not place them in bags.)





\*Make sure to mark on the bottles. If not, they may be misidentified as tea bottles and may not be collected. \*Take care when taking them out so that they will not turn over and be separated from other waste.

## Instructions for Large Items and Bulky Large Items

#### ●Large Items (600 yen/item)

Items with a size approximately over 50 cm in length, width or height, including furniture such as chests, bookshelves, tables, desks and chairs, bedding such as futons\*, and mattresses (excluding spring mattresses), bicycles, electric appliances, carpets\*, etc.

\*Some items in a size that can be put in a plastic bag up to 45L with the top tide off may be taken out as combustible waste. Example: Light futons, entrance hall mats, carpets, etc.

#### Bulky Large Items (1,200 yen/item)

Large items with a size approximately over 1 m in length, width or height, including following 8 items:

①Furniture such as chests and shelves (There are some exceptions. Please contact the Waste Treatment Center in your district for details.) ②Beds, sofa beds (excluding spring mattresses) ③Drawing room lounge chair (for two or more) ④Tables (with a top area of over 1.2 square meter) ⑤Desks, drawing tables ⑥Organs, electric organs ⑦Steel stands or racks that are broke down and occupy an area of 1.65 square meters or over and less than 3.3 square meters. ⑧Health appliances such as massaging chairs

## 1) Procedure to request the city for pick-up

①Make reservation at the Waste Treatment Center in your district on the phone.

Following information will be confirmed: ①your address, ②your name,

- ③your phone number, ④item and size,
  ⑤ number of items (up to 5 at a time),
- ⑤ place to which you put the waste out,⑦ pick-up date and ⑧ handling charge.
- \*\* Pick-up on the day of reservation is not possible and you cannot designate the pick-up date, as a rule.



Please check the item you want to dispose and call the "Clean Center."

2) Purchase Large Item Stickers.

\*\*Two types of sticker are available at 600 yen or 1,200 yen, depending on the type and the size of item.

\* Make sure to have the stickers affixed with payment receipt stamp on them.

Any charge paid cannot be returned and stickers will not be reissued. Please be sure to make reservation for pick-up at the Clean Center and confirm the amount of charge before purchasing them.

Write your name on the large item sticker and affix the sticker on the large item and then bring it to the designated place.

\*The place will be outdoors in principle.

※Any large item will not be collected if the sticker does not have a receipt stamp or the paid amount of charge is insufficient.

- Please bring the item to the place by 8:30 in the morning on the pick-up day.
- You don't have to be present at the pick-up time in the case of large items or bulky large items only.

#### Instructions for special waste (waste generated from moving or big cleanups)

Large amount of recyclable waste or garbage generated from moving or big cleanups (more than 5 plastic bags of 45L) cannot be taken out at a clean station. You have to request the relevant Clean Center for pick-up or drop them off at the Clean Center for yourself.

- \*\*In the case of pick-up or drop off, you are also required to properly sort out recyclable items and garbage.
- \*When you requested for pick-up, you have to be present at the time of pick-up.

[Request for pick-up]

●Handling charge: 4,200 yen/1 cubic meter

#### [Drop-off]

•Handling charge:

For items not exceeding 100 kg, it costs 500 yen per drop-off. For items exceeding 100 kg, 200 yen is added for every additional 10 kg.

Example: 700 yen will be charged for 110 kg

# Regydable Items and Waste Not Handled by the City

#### Specified household appliances (air conditioners, TV sets, refrigerators, laundry washers, cloth driers)

Air conditioners (both window and split-system units), TV sets (CRT, liquid crystal and plasma types), refrigerators, freezers, laundry washers and cloth driers which were manufactured and sold for household use cannot be collected by the City. Please dispose them following either of the methods described below.

#### Methods of disposal of household appliances no longer used (with a charge)

Method 1 Method 2 Ask the store you purchased the household appliance to dispose it. When you replace the appliance with new one, ask the store from which you purchase new product for disposal of the old one.

Method 3 Ask a recycling company who can accept the electric appliance recycle cards to pick up and transport the item (contact the city office for information of those companies).

Method 4 Bring the appliance to the designated waste receiving location yourself. Please be sure to first purchase electric appliance recycle cards from a post office or Japan Post Bank and then contact the designated waste receiving location before you bring it to the place.

#### Caution! (警告)

  - We accept empty lighters as Combustible waste.
  - We accept empty aerosol spray cans small gas cartridges as Hazardous/Toxic waste.
