Practice safety measures for disasters like earthquakes. These drills take place in local communities and schools.

11 Voluntary disaster prevention organization

During a disaster, government office may not be able to function. Each Jichi-kai/Chounai-kai (neighborhood/residents' associations) have 自主防災組織 (voluntary disaster prevention organization) to help each other out locally.

Be sure to prepare you and your family!

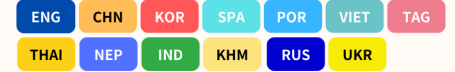
1 Register for disaster prevention/safety information email (Free)

You will receive warnings, information on evacuation centers, and contents of the bousai-musen (emergency community broadcast system).

3 Check the location and access to your evacuation center



About evacuation centers

Evacuation centers are opened by the Kamakura City. Anybody can go.

Assess whether you should go to an evacuation center. You may go before the situation worsens. Be warned that usual streets may become dangerous.

Think about various situations. When you are at home, go to the nearest evacuation center. If you are at school or work, follow their evacuation rules. Schools usually provide guidelines for parents.

4 Prepare emergency survival kit.

In case of disaster

1 Protect your own life first.

2 Check your family's safety.

You may not be able to use your mobile. Use "Saigai-dengon-dial" (disaster message dial).

Dial 171

To record: Press 1 → Dial in your phone number → Press 1 → Record → Press 9.

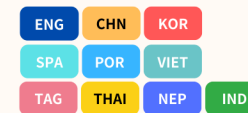
To listen to recordings: Press 2 → Dial the number of the person that you want to listen to recording of → Press 1 to listen → Press 8 to listen once more, Press 9 to end.

3 Collect information.

There may not be electricity or radio waves. Please help each other.
